

Prof. Dr. Kimon Christanis, a mining engineer by primary graduation (NTU Athens, 1977), has received the doctoral degree from the University of Braunschweig, Germany (1982). He worked as research assistant at the Universities of Braunschweig (1979-1980) and Erlangen Germany (1982-1983). After the military service he worked in the private sector and the Public Power Corporation of Greece (1985-1989); since 1989 he serves as academic staff at the University of Patras, Department of Geology, Section of Earth Materials. He has a long research record in the fields of peat and coal geology, and the environmental impacts from the utilization of fossil fuels. He served as Deputy Chair (2003-2009) and Chair of the Department of Geology, University of Patras (2009-2013), and Director of the Section of Earth Materials (2013-2014). Since November 2016 he serves as Director of the Laboratory of Electron Microscopy and Microanalysis of the Faculty of Natural Sciences, University of Patras, and since July 2017 as President of the Council of the Institute of Geology and Mineral Exploration, Athens. Since 2005 he is the Organizer of the Single Coal Accreditation Program (SCAP) of the International Committee for Coal and Organic Petrology (ICCP). Since 2010 he is member of the editorial board of the *International Journal of Coal Geology* (Elsevier) and since 2017 section editor of the *Bulletin of the Greek Geological Society*. Prof. Christanis has been granted several projects from both State and Industry affiliations, and has published more than 100 papers in peer reviewed journals; his papers received more than 900 citations in the SCI system.
